






#### ELECTORAL COLLEGE SHIFTED TOWARDS US, BUT STILL CLOSE












#### PRO-TRUMP FORCES HAVE SHIFTED SPENDING TO FOCUS ON BATTLEGROUND






#### IN 2019-20 TRUMP + ALLIES SPEND MOST ON NATIONAL TV BUYS










# **NEW BATTLEGROUND POLLING**

## Methodology

#### ONLINE SURVEY: LIKELY VOTERS


- 3,482 voters across six key battleground states: Arizona, Florida, Michigan, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin
- Conducted May 22<sup>nd</sup> to June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020
- 14% did not vote in 2016 (Among those who voted: 46% Clinton, 48% Trump, 6% third-party candidate)
- Results weighted in proportion to share of electoral votes per state. Within states, results weighted to demographics of a likely presidential electorate.
- Sixth is a series of quarterly tracking surveys conducted during 2019 and 2020 in Florida, Michigan, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin; where trend-over-time is shown, data limited to these four states.




#### Voters are increasingly pessimistic about the direction of the country

- Changed somewhat for the worse




#### Trump is in his weakest position in our 2020 polling

How motivated and enthusiastic would you say you feel about voting in the 2020 elections?



Of the following issues, which one is the most important to you right now? And which one or two of the remaining issues are the next important to you? [TOP CHOICES COMBINED]\*








#### Near universal belief that police mistreatment of black Americans is a problem







## PRIORITIES' VOTING RIGHTS LITIGATION





#### REPUBLICAN VOTER SUPPRESSION EFFORTS

#### **Poll Watchers**

The RNC is recruiting 50,000 poll watchers across 15 states, an intimidation tactic to stop people from voting.

#### **Monetary Investment**

The RNC has dedicated \$20 million to voter suppression and millions have already been spent to combat our Voting Rights litigation.

#### **Misinformation Campaigns**

Trump has actively attacked voting by mail, using his office to combat efforts to promote voter safety through vote by mail.

#### **Republican Opposition**

The Senate has blocked three election security bills and GOP members have filed in the Supreme Court to challenge the Voting Rights Act.



#### FOUR PILLARS LITIGATION

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, we've increased our investment in Voting Rights to \$32 million and pivoted our litigation program by either leading or supporting these types of filings in **Arizona**, **Florida**, **Michigan**, and **Pennsylvania**.

Each of these filings address the same four gaps in state vote by mail laws:

- 1) Government pre-paid postage on ballots
- 2) Ballots postmarked on or before election day must be counted
- 3) Allow community organizations to collect and deliver absentee ballots
- 4) Reform or eliminate signature matching laws
